

South America Indicators

- GDP \$4.8 trillion in 2010, up 6.1% from 2009
- Total regional trade ~ \$300 billion in 2011
- Average regional growth around 4% a year
- Twice the regional trade than with China
- Brazil: seventh largest global economy
- Mexico: third largest trading partner



Trade Comparisons






Free Trade Agreements

Product Stewardship

Trend: Region is adopting and now implementing a broad range of product stewardship requirements for a diverse set of products and packaging.

Peru: Draft final e-waste takeback rules (December 2011)

Chile: Proposed WEEE-RoHS bill (April 2012)



Contaminated Sites

Trend: Region continues to adopt "polluter pays" regimes for contaminated sites; some jurisdictions well implemented and beginning to look at brownfields redevelopment.

Trend: Region continues to increase environmental protections from mineral extraction activities, in particular mining.

Peru: Standards to control illegal mining (Spring 2012)

Costa Rica: Ban on open-pit mining (January 2011)

Ecuador: Proposed amended penalties to Mining Code
(October 2011)

Chile: Bill to protect communities from mining (Fall 2011)



Air Quality

Trend: Region beginning to renew focus on air quality issues, in particular stationary sources.

Brazil: Stationary source emissions for pre-2007 facilities (December 2011)

Bogota: Stationary source emissions (March 2012))

Chile: Standards for fine particulate matter (PM 2.5) (January 2011)

Costa Rica: Standards for boilers and furnaces (July 2011)

Key Pending Standards

Chile: Proposed amendments to PM-10 standards (November 2011)

Colombia: Proposed noxious odor and complaint rules (Fall, 2011)

Mexico: Proposed amendments to air quality regulations (Spring, 2011)



Transparency & Enforceability

Trend: Region is adopting novel and progressive mechanisms to enforce environmental standards with increased transparency.

Key Final Initiatives

Mexico: Collective actions law (August 2011)

Brazil: Environmental compensation fees for projects (July 2011)

Colombia: Penalty calculations rules (October 2010)

Peru: Accepting comments on Facebook (March 2012)



Key Enforcement Cases

Trend: Continued pattern of high-profile deterrent enforcement.
