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Sustainable Packaging

Sustainable Packaging:


- Is beneficial, safe & healthy for individuals and communities throughout its life cycle;
- Meets market criteria for both performance and cost;
- Is sourced, manufactured, transported, and recycled using renewable energy;
- Optimizes the use of renewable or recycled source materials;
- Is manufactured using clean production technologies and best practices;
- Is made from materials healthy in all probable end of life scenarios;
- Is physically designed to optimize materials and energy;
- Is effectively recovered and utilized in biological and/or industrial closed loop cycles.


Packaging Global Consumption by Region

Packaging Take-Back Initiatives Broad Scope

- Packaging in General
 - Ex: Uruguay Packaging Law and Implementing Decree (Law 17.849 of 2004 and Decree 260 of 2007)
 - Ex: Costa Rica Regulation on Management of Ordinary Solid Wastes (Decree 36093-S/2010) (effective Feb.16, 2011)
 - Ex: Mexico Draft Urban Solid Waste NOM
- Most Packaging
 - Ex: Argentina Packaging Bill PL 1226-D-2010 (except for packaging of exclusive use in the agricultural and livestock sector)
- Consumer Goods
 - Ex: São Paulo State SMA Resolution 24/2010



Latin American Region Packaging Take-Back Initiatives Product-Specific Scope

- Pesticides and packaging
- Agrotoxins and packaging
- Oil lubricants and packaging
- Pharmaceuticals and packaging



Latin American Region Packaging Take-Back Waste Classification

- Colombia Waste Decree 4741/05
 - Management plan by generator (including manufacturer and importer) required for post-consumption products that become hazardous wastes upon discard
 - Packaging in contact with hazardous waste also deemed hazardous waste
- Mexico General Law for the Prevention and Integral Management of Wastes
 - Manufacturers, importers, exporters and distributors must develop management plans for listed Article 31 wastes (includes pesticide packaging)



Catin American RegionOther Packaging Trends

- Design for Environment
 - Solid Waste Laws
 - Brazil Solid Waste Law 12.305/2010 and Costa Rica Solid Waste Law 8839/2010)
 - Zero Waste Laws
 - Buenos Aires Zero Waste Law (Law 1.854/2006)
 - Green Purchasing Requirements
 - Brazil's Instructional Norm 1/2010 and Green IT Specifications



Latin American Region Other Packaging Trends

Bans

- Mexico City's Ban of Free Plastic Shopping Bags
- Buenos Aires Province and City Phase Out of Plastic Shopping Bags
- Many others

Labeling

- Chile's Bill Proposing Labels Informing Consumers of Water Used in Packaging
- Brazilian Bill Proposing Non-biodegradable Packaging Labels
