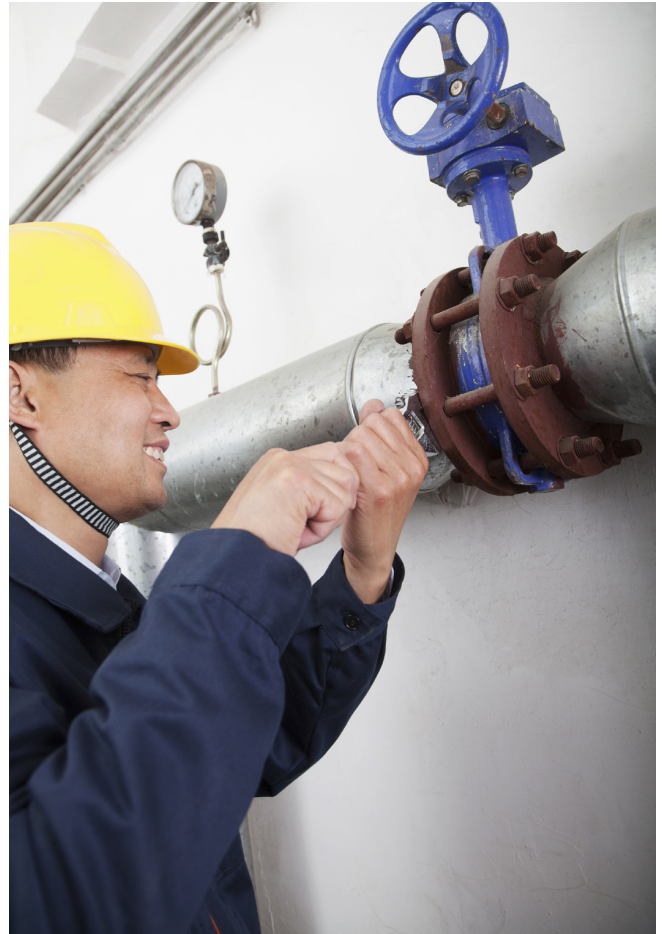
Who We Are

What We Discuss

The Roundtable conducts two in-person meetings each year in the U.S. and China, typically in the spring and fall, on topics that directly affect the operations of our members.

- » Process safety (corporate standards versus Chinese standards)
- » Local government updates, including technology development zone regulatory approaches
- » Circular economy regulatory and policy development
- » Emergency planning, including contagious disease planning
- » Health law and policy updates
